

It's been a slow, unfolding answer to prayer in the 16 years since. The life-giving "home" I so desperately needed came in 2007 in the form of Urban Grace. Where I found community. Where I met my future husband in the pews. Where I was married. Where we dedicated our daughter and where we'll soon dedicate our son (due this December). I never would have thought a church, of all places, could be a home. God and the healing and hope I have found at Urban Grace have shown me otherwise.
